What is Work-Based Learning?

Students in the WBL program graduate from high school with real-world work experience. They leave high school with an advantage: Office Certifications (Word, Excel, and/or Powerpoint), armed with work skills and community service/volunteer experience, a professional resume and career portfolio, interviewing skills, and the ability to make clear, well thought out decisions about their career aspirations. In addition to work experience, leadership development, as well as career and college exploration, most of the WBL students receive multiple college acceptances and attend 2- and 4-year colleges and universities. Our students have taken Honors and AP classes. Additionally, each year there are several honor graduates that complete the program. These students also actively participate in our nationally recognized Career and Technical Education Student Associations (DECA, FBLA, FCCLA, FFA, HOSA, and SkillsUSA).

Students must:

- Be Juniors and Seniors & at least 16 years old
- Have an identified career goal
- Provide your own dependable transportation to/from job site
- Maintain good attendance record
- Be on track to graduate
- Take or have taken courses related to future employment with in the identified career area
- All paid positions must meet requirements of minimum wage, overtime, child labor, equal pay and applicable tax withholding.
